Guide to Good Environmental Practices for Suppliers and Service Providers

As part of its Integrated Quality and Environmental Management System, in accordance with ISO 9001 and ISO 14001, Polymark would like to make aware to all its suppliers to comply with environmental legislations and good environmental practices applicable to its activities.



Consumption of Natural Resources

Natural resources are those that the planet provides without the need for human intervention. They are essential for our survival, but if they are consumed at a faster rate than their natural regeneration, they could run out!

Implement water efficiency measures - Water is life. Do not waste it!

Make the most of natural light.

Do not use air conditioning systems with the doors open. Switch off computer equipment when you have finished using it.

Adopt more efficient driving habits that reduce fuel consumption and the emission of polluting gases.

Waste Management

Promote the reduction of consumption and the reuse of materials in order to minimise waste production.

Deposit the waste produced in properly identified containers and separate it according to the EWC (European Waste Codes). Recycle your waste by sending it to licensed and authorised waste management companies.

Where applicable, submit the MIRR (Integrated Waste Registration Map) annually.

The supplier is responsible for managing any waste arising from the services provided to Polymark.

Environmental noise

For outdoor activities, use equipment that complies with the legally defined noise levels.

Switch on the equipment only for the time needed to carry out the tasks.



Liquid effluents

Adopt measures to minimise water pollution.

If you produce industrial wastewater, obtain the relevant discharge licence according to your city/country.

Implement a wastewater self-monitoring plan in accordance with the current legislation on liquid effluents and report the results.

Air Quality

If applicable, measures must be adopted to minimise the emission of atmospheric pollutants.

If you have fixed emission sources, characterise them and report the results in accordance with the current legislation on gaseous effluents.

Omissions

For all unmentioned procedures, please check the legal requirements in force in your city/country.

Chemicals / Spillages

All chemical products must be properly packaged, labelled and accompanied by safety information.

In the event of a chemical spillage, protective gloves must be worn, and absorbent materials used to prevent contamination of water and/or soil. The resulting waste must be collected and sent to a waste management company for appropriate treatment.
